COMPREHENSIVE GUIDELINES IN THE CONDUCT OF 2025 ONLINE REGIONAL RESEARCH COLLOQUIUM CUM QUARTERLY BERF PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION REVIEW (PIR)

I. Rationale

In its quest to further intensify the research culture in our region, PPRD has maximized varied mechanisms. One of its major innovations for FY 2025 is the "Conduct of Regional Research Colloquium," a platform that fosters in-depth discussions and collaborative exploration of FY 2024 BERF completed outputs.

A colloquium typically refers to a formal meeting where experts present and discuss their research findings in an interactive and conversational setting. Hence, in the context of DepEd SOCCSKSARGEN, this Regional Research Colloquium is a specialized academic event or gathering that brings BERF Recipients, researchers, and experts to discuss and share research outputs online to all governance levels of education in schools, districts, and division offices.

Moreover, the 2025 Regional Research Colloquium focuses on deeply understanding the unique characteristics, challenges, and opportunities of our learners, teachers, and school heads through the lens of the research conducted, analyzed, and interpreted. This completed research can be categorized into four themes under DepEd Order 39, series of 2016 entitled, "Adoption of the Basic Education Research Agenda." The identified themes are well-aligned with the Department's mission, mainly geared towards its four key stakeholders. The theme of "Teaching and Learning" responds to students' and teachers' needs; "Child Protection" focuses on the students' well-being; "Human Resource Development" addresses concerns of teaching and non-teaching staff; and "Governance" centers on administration and stakeholders' engagement.


Integral in this activity is the "Conduct of BERF PIR," a progress monitoring and evaluation initiative to determine the facilitating and hindering factors affecting the implementation of the BERF program. Objectively, this would provide the PPRD with inputs in crafting technical assistance as a continuous improvement mechanism for its division counterparts on issues that require regional office interventions.

To fully benefit from this worthwhile undertaking, this guideline is hereby presented to guide all concerned FY 2024 BERF Recipients, research enthusiasts, and policy implementers. 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II. Goal and Objectives

Specifically, it aims to:

- (a) facilitate knowledge exchange among BERF recipients as well as with participants for further utilization of research outputs;
- (b) promote interdisciplinary collaboration among varied education stakeholders for potential research partnerships;
- (c) create a space for in-depth discussions to monitor and evaluate the extent of utilization of research findings; and
- (d) build professional networks for future endeavors through research collaboration or sharing research outputs in LAC Sessions at all governance levels.

- The presenter must provide an advance copy of the presentation deck and a recorded version of their presentation in not more than 15 minutes.
- The recorded video presentation will be presented online, while the questionand-answer portion with the Reactor will be done live.

B. Best Oral Presenter

- All oral presenters in every episode in the online colloquium are eligible for the award.
- Presenters will be evaluated based on the given set of criteria below:

B.1 Oral Presentation (20%)

- o Logical Presentation based on the video (10%)
- o Substance and Clarity of Ideas during the Interpellation (10%)






D. Reactors' Time
