- 1. The Schools Division of Tacurong City, through the Curriculum Implementation shall conduct the **2025 Division Musabaqah Skills Exhibition on November 20, 2025,** which shall start at 8:30 am at Tacurong Pilot Elementary School Gymnasium, Tacurong City.
- 2. The activity aims to:
 - a. provide the ALIVE learners with appropriate and relevant opportunities through a competition;
 - showcase skills and performance as evidence of the pupils learning;
 - strengthen and upgrade the pupils' level of competence in facing life challenges;
 - d. encourage ALIVE teachers to create a satisfactory teaching and learning activities in the ALIVE Program; and
 - e. reinforce support of administrators, key officials, parents, and communities to the ALIVE Program.
- 3. The participants to this activity are ALIVE Teachers both permanent and Contract of Service (COS) and learner participants/contestants.



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- 4. All expenses incurred such as cash prizes, supplies and materials, food, and honorarium of judges and other involved in the activity, and other supplemental activity shall be charged against Madrasah Education Fund subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and procedures.
- 5. Each cluster through the School ALIVE coordinators should submit documents duly signed by the School Heads certifying that their contestants are officially enrolled for SY 2025-2026.
- 6. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

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2025 Musabaquah Skills Exhibition

(A Showcase of Talents and Skills in Arabic Language and Islamic Values)

CONTEXTUALIZED ALIVE MUSABAQAH GUIDELINES

- The Musabaqah is open to all learners in the public schools who are enrolled and tagged in LIS as ALIVE learners.
- 2. Participants should have registered and complied with the following requirements prior to the activity:
 - a. Certification as Winner/SDO Memorandum.
 - b. Parents' Consent.
 - c. PSA-annotated Birth Certificate.
 - d. Accomplished Entry Form.
 - e. School Form 10 (for Verification).
 - f. Medical Certificate and
 - g. School ID
- 3. Any participant who fails to comply with the requirements and the qualifications specific to each category shall be disqualified.
- 4. Filled out entry form should be submitted at least two weeks before the conduct of the activity.
- 5. The participants shall be given a control number to conceal the school they represent.
- 6. Winners in each category shall receive medals. All participants shall receive a certificate of participation.
- 7. Winning coaches shall receive certificate of recognition while non-winning coaches will be given a certificate of participation.
- 8. The top 3 schools shall be awarded with a plaque of recognition.
- 9. Only official coaches can file an appeal to the Grievance Committee, should there be contest.
- 10. The whole proceedings shall be recorded by the DTWG.
- 11. The decision of the judges is final and irrevocable.
- 12. The detailed contest guidelines and criteria for each *musabaqah* events are as follows:

TIME ALLOTMENT	5-7 minutes (including preparations)

DESCRIPTION	An oration is an act of performing a speech to a live audience such as "Naseehah" (Speech) to inform, persuade, and entertain.

I. Event Rules and Mechanics

- 1.1. There shall be one (1) participant, grade 5, male or female, ages ten to eleven (10-11).
- 1.2. The participant shall be given five to seven (5-7) minutes including preparations.
- 1.3. At the first bell, the participant shall get ready. At the second bell, the participant shall start the "Muqaddimah" (Introduction). At the third bell, the participant may stop as he/she already consumed the minimum number of minutes or continue until the fourth bell for the maximum number of minutes. The participant whose speech is shorter than the minimum requirement of five



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(5) minutes as well as those who exceeded the maximum of
seven (7) minutes will get a deduction of one (1) point from
his/her total score for every minute or a fraction thereof in
excess/deficit of the allotted time.

- 1.4. The participant may choose English or Filipino as a medium of delivery.
- 1.5. "Adillah" (evidence) from the Qur'an and Hadith should be recited in the Arabic Language.
- The printed copy of the entry shall be submitted to the DTWG Secretariat.
- 1.7. The oration (naseehah) shall not, in whole or in part, expressly or impliedly, subvert the principles of democracy, offend any religion, sect, or creed, or violate either the standards of decency or the laws on libel and oral defamation.

PERFORMANCE STANDARD	The learner demonstrates oral fluency on Arabic phonemes, phonetics, and alphabets by pronouncing the letters correctly with speed and accuracy through cognition and psychomotor.

DESCRIPTION	Harf Touch is an NFOT event category of Musabaqah that allows blind-folded learner-participants to touch the surface of the illustration board with engraved Arabic letters. Learner-participants are expected to identify, recognize, and pronounce Arabic letters correctly with speed and accuracy within the allotted time. This activity enhances familiarization of the Arabic letter
	through cognition and psychomotor.
CRITERIA FOR ASSESSMENT	There shall be one (1) point given for every Arabic letter that is correctly identified and pronounced by learner-participants.

I. Event Rules and Mechanics

- A. There shall be one (1) participant per SDO, Grade 2, male or female, ages seven to eight (7-8).
- B. During the contest proper, the participants shall be seated at the designated holding area. They should not see the process undergone by the contestant on stage.
- C. The participants take turns on stage to identify the letters engraved/cut on illustration board within one (1) minute. The facilitator mixes the 28 letters as they take their turns.
- D. There shall be one (1) timekeeper/buzzer, one (1) recorder, one (1) tabulator and a panel of judges.
- E. Timekeeper shall signal the start and the end of time allotted for each participant.
- F. Panel of judges shall confirm the number of the correctly identified Arabic letters.
- G. The recorder tallies the scores.
- H. The corresponding time of each participant shall be flashed on the screen.



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- I. The three participants with the highest number of correctly identified Arabic letters in a shortest recorded time shall be declared as the winner. There shall be first, second and third winners. In case of tie, another three (3) letters shall be added to twenty-eight (28) letters for the clincher round to be given by the board of judges to determine in the place/rank from which they tied. One point shall be given for every correct response.
- J. The whole proceedings shall be recorded by the RTWG.

I. Event Rules and Mechanics

- A. There shall be one (1) participant per SDO, male or female, ages twelve to thirteen (12-13).
- B. During the contest proper, the participants shall be seated at the designated holding area. They should not see the process undergone by the contestant on stage.
- C. The panel of judges shall choose the surah to be read by the learner-participants.
- D. The participants shall read the selected surah in Tawasot.
- E. Each participant shall bring a copy of the Holy Qur'an.



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- F. Participants should wear proper attire (black abayah and white kombong/hijab for female and kimon with totob/kopya for male).
- G. The participant shall be seated on the floor with the book stand and use the microphone in the actual reading of the selected *surah*.
- H. The participant shall read the surah or ayah in tawasot within five (5) minutes.

Event Rules and Mechanics

- A. There shall be one (1) participant, ages six to twelve (6-12 years old from any grade level (male).
- B. The participant performs the Adhan verbally in a maximum of five (5) minutes including the preparation.
- C. The proctor (one of the judges) shall say "Ibda" (start), then, the participant begins to perform the adzan and may opt to stop when the bell/buzzer rings.
- D. There shall be first, second and third winners to be declared. In case of tie in any of the top of three ranks, clincher round shall be given by board of judges to determine in the place/rank from which they tied.
- E. There shall be one (1) timekeeper, one (1) recorder, one (1) tabulator and three (3) panel of Judges.
- F. The timekeeper shall ring the buzzer to end the allotted time.
- G. The time recorder and tabulator shall record the time and tally the scores.

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Arabic Language Spelling (Imla)

Description	Arabic Spelling Exhibition is one of the exciting features for the Muslim learner to showcase their listening and writing skills in Arabic Language by means of forming words from letters.
Objectives	This category aims to showcase the skills of the MEP learners to: 1. Spell Arabic words quickly, accurately and with comprehension; and 2. Write the words correctly in its nuskhah and cursive form with complete vowels
Materials	 12x18 White Board White Board Marker & Eraser Bell/Buzzer

1. Mechanics

- 1.1 There shall be one (1) participant, ages nine to eleven (9-11) years old from levels II and III (male or female).
- 1.2 The spelling exhibition shall be categorized into three (3) rounds, namely easy, average and difficult
- 1.3 The medium of instruction to be used is Arabic language.



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- 1.4 There shall be ten (10) words for each category. For EASY round (Noun with 3 syllables), AVERAGE round (Noun with 4 syllables) and DIFFICULT round (5 syllables).
- 1.5 Each word shall be read twice, the participants shall write their answer in nuskhah and cursive form with complete vowel. In ten (10) seconds for easy round, fifteen (15) seconds for average and thirty (30) seconds for the difficult round on the whiteboard provided. The team participants shall immediately raise their whiteboard after the buzzer.
- 1.6 After each round is done, the scores will be totaled.
- 1.7 The three participants with the highest points win. They will be declared first, second and third winners. In case of tie in any of the top of three ranks, clincher round shall be given by board of judges to determine in the place/rank from which they tied.

2. Criteria for Judging

1.1 Scoring shall be based on the following:

Easy	1 point
Average	2 points
Difficult	3 points

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Islamic Values Quiz

Description	Islamic Values Quiz Bee shall test the learner's knowledge and understanding on the cultures, traditions, practices, and belief that promote peace by answering questions derived from Islamic Values Education subject.		
Objectives	This category aims to showcase the skills of the MEP learners to: 1. Demonstrate the mastery level on the content of Islamic Values Education; and 2. Display the value of unity, and sportsmanship among Muslim learners.		
Materials	 Show-me whiteboard Marker & Pen Timer Bell/Buzzer 		

1. Mechanics

- 1.1 There shall be one (1) participant, ages six to eleven (6-11) years old (male or female).
- 1.2 The officials for this category are the quizmaster, proctors, timekeeper and recorder.
- 1.3 There shall be three (3) rounds of questions namely easy, average and difficult rounds. The easy round shall have ten (10) questions at one (1) point each. The average round shall have five (5) questions at two (2) points each. The difficult round shall have five (5) questions at three (3) points each.
- 1.4 Questions in the easy and average round should be in multiple choice in nature with 4 letter options. Difficult round question has no options, thus the team shall write the correct answer on the show-me board. Wrong spelling in both English and Arabic is wrong. If answers are written in Arabic, it must be in Nushka form with complete vowel.



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- 1.5 The correct spelling of the transliterated words shall be based on how it was written in the Madrasah curriculum and textbooks.
- 1.6 Each of the questions shall be read twice by the quizmaster. After the second reading, the quizmaster will say "Go". The team then will write their answer in the whiteboard within ten (10) seconds for easy and average rounds and twenty (20) seconds for difficult round.
- 1.7 When the time is up, the timekeeper rings the bell/buzzer. The team then shall stop answering and show their answer to the proctor by raising their show-me board.
- 1.8 The proctor will read the answer of each team and record in the tally board and tally sheet.
- 1.9 After each round, points will be tabulated. The final scores will be tabulated after the difficult round.
- 1.10 The three teams with the highest points win. They will be declared as first, second and third place winners respectively.
- 1.11 In case of tie, a clincher round shall be given. The first one to give the correct answer shall be the winner. If no team is able to give the correct answer, another clincher question shall be given until a winner comes up.



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Arabic Calligraphy

Description	The Arabic Calligraphy will produce a simple, creative artistic Arabic letter writing to convey an immediate identity of Madrasah Education Program (MEP). This serves also as an expression of Muslim children's artistic skill in writing Arabic letters/characters and visual arts.		
Objectives	This exhibition category aims to enhance the innovativeness and creativity among MEP learners through Visual Arts. 99 Names of ALLAH

1. Mechanics

- 1.1 There shall be one (1) participant, ages nine to twelve (9-12) years old from Grades 4 to 6 (male or female).
- 1.2 The allotted time should be two hours.
- 1.3 There shall be first, second and third winners to be declared.
- 1.4 There shall be one (1) time keeper, one (1) recorder, one (1) tabulator and three (3) panel of Judges.
